S. McColl).

Bearsden Public Toilets

Outwith the umbrella of Mosshead Residents Association, Josie Beeley and Sheila Hamilton produced a 'Save our Bearsden Cross Public Toilets' petition. The petition was placed in ten shops at Bearsden Cross for one week and attracted over 1,000 signatures. This petition was presented to the EDC Chief Executive.

In the meantime Councillor Duncan Cumming in conjunction with Josie and Sheila liaised with council staff and in the end came up with a proposal to reopen the disabled toilet provision at Bearsden Burgh Hall, which would not involve large scale building work or expense. This came before the Policy and Resources Committee on 26th August and was unanimously approved by all Councillors present. Council workmen will start refurbishing the toilet space in early September and it should be completed for early October.

The unisex disabled toilet unit will be open six days a week from 8 a.m. until 6 p.m., and it will be approached by a ramp from outside the building. In due course the building housing the discontinued public toilets at the Roman Road car park will be sold off providing the Council with some much needed funds in their quest to reduce their outgoings by at least £30m over the next three years.



Muse Developers

Flames and black smoke were seen from Mosshead (and quite a distance beyond) when debris was set on fire towards the end of the demolition work involved in removing the old halls of residence (listed buildings!) from the still to be developed portion of St Andrew's Campus. The Fire Service was on duty overnight damping down the smouldering remains, and there were no injuries and no damage to nearby buildings. The fire delayed the completion of the tidying up of the site, but the sub-contractors did a good job in catching up. Further building will be due there, and planning applications will doubtless appear towards the end of this year.

Pavements

An increasing number of residents have been complaining about blocked and obstructed pavements. This has been getting worse over the last few months. Vans, cars, building materials, wheelie bins and recycling boxes are some of the common culprits. Placed on pavements without consideration, these cause problems for mothers with prams, the frail and/or elderly walking by aid of sticks, people with poor sight, those registered as blind, children walking to/from school. Please park all vehicles, your own, your visitors and tradesmen's with all wheels on the road if at all possible; it also helps cut down on speeding traffic. Do not park on or close to corners – it's illegal. Building materials should be either kept on your property or on the Road if permission has been obtained from the Council.

Tuesdays are a particular problem and even if you put out your own bins and boxes tidily you should retrieve them as soon as possible after they are emptied. If you are going to be away ask a neighbour to help by taking them in for you - rather than advertising your absence to housebreakers.

Stockiemuir Court Sheltered Housing

The Council is discontinuing the provision of housing accommodation in sheltered housing for wardens since their hours of work will change. This means the warden and her family at the above complex will be re-housed by the Council within their housing stock once suitable premises become available. Meanwhile they will stay in the present accommodation. In due course the existing warden accommodation will be refurbished and adapted so that it can be offered to those in need of sheltered housing. The rumour that the vacant warden houses will be given to young homeless people is completely untrue.

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Car Number Plates.

Motorists are warned of an increase in thefts of number plates which are then used temporarily on cars where the driver fills up with petrol then drives away from a petrol station without paying. If you do not garage your car overnight, check your car carefully.
